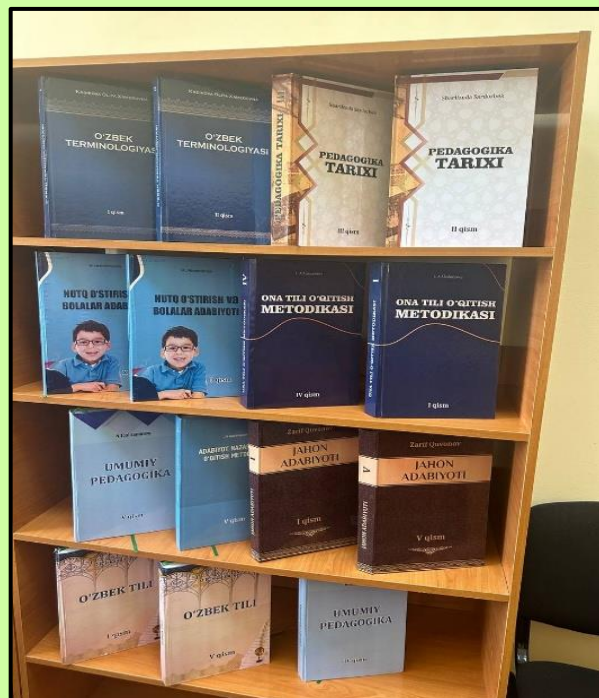

- Academic accommodations.



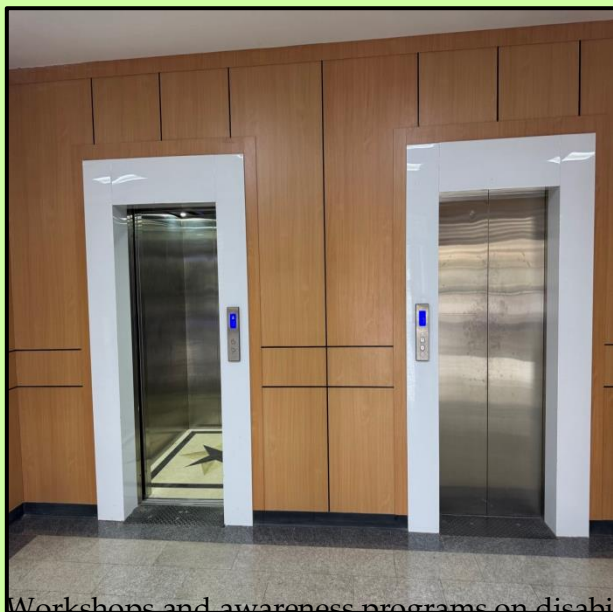


- Accessible learning materials and technologies

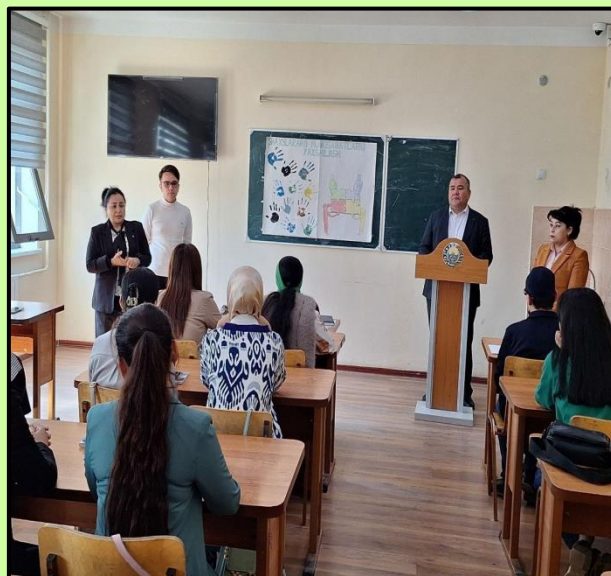




- Mobility assistance and accessible transportation
